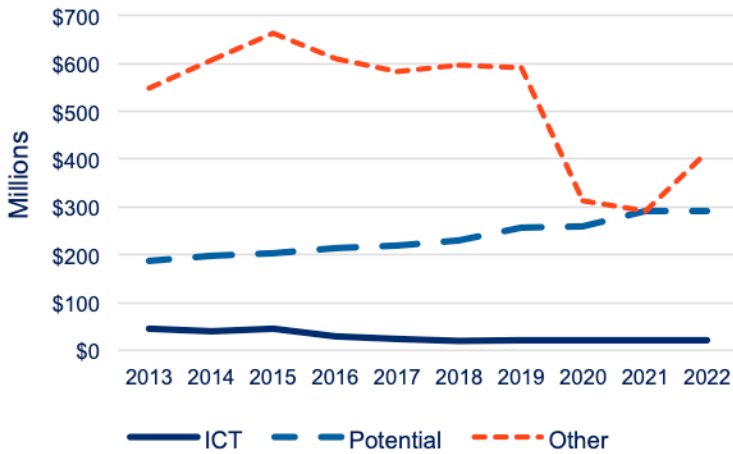




# Texas' 19th and Digital Trade

TX-19 Services Exports, 2013-2022



ICT services exports fell from \$44 million in 2013 to \$22 million in 2022 (-50%), but still supported 42 direct and 36 indirect jobs in 2022.

Potentially ICT-enabled services exports grew from \$186 million to \$292 million (57%), supporting 793 direct and 632 indirect jobs in 2022.

Exports of other services grew from \$548 million in 2013 to \$590 million in 2019 (8%), before falling sharply due to Covid-19. They have not yet fully recovered.

**Texas' 19th district's digitally tradeable services exports supported 835 direct and 668 indirect American jobs in 2022.**

Europe was Texas' 19th district's top market for digitally tradeable services, followed by Asia & Pacific (ex. China).

Texas' 19th district's exports of potentially ICT-enabled services to Ireland grew from \$9 million in 2013 to \$26 million (+187%) in 2022.

The "Digital Dozen" accounted for \$125 million out of Texas' 19th district's \$314 million in exports of digitally tradeable services in 2022.

Computer software services are the top ICT services export, growing from \$1.7 million in 2013 to \$7.1 million in 2022 (323%).

Payments for trademarks are Texas' 19th district's top potentially ICT-enabled services export, growing from \$39 million in 2013 to \$44 million in 2022 (13%).
